

North Australian Marine Research Alliance: NAMRA

Postdoctoral Fellowships

NAMRA is a research collaboration between Australian Institute of Marine Science, Charles Darwin University, Australian National University, and Northern Territory Government. We are building marine research capability in Northern Australia by investing in postgraduate education and early career researchers, providing opportunities for emerging researchers to work in multidisciplinary teams on exciting projects.

NAMRA has four initial research themes:

- **Marine Biodiversity and Natural Resource Management**
- **Estuarine and Coastal Processes** (with an initial focus on Darwin Harbour);
- **Ocean Dynamics (including palaeoceanography)**; and
- **Marine and Coastal Livelihoods and Governance.**

NAMRA will fund up to three Post-doctoral Fellowships for up to three years including up to \$20,000 pa for operational support.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be no more than 5 years out from completion of their PhD;
- The research project must be in one of the identified NAMRA research themes;
- The project must include collaboration with at least 2, but preferably 3, of the NAMRA partners.

Applications:

Applications should contain the following:

- A statement of the significance of the proposed research project in the context of the NAMRA Themes;
- A brief (max. 3 page) outline of the proposed project;
- Collaboration arrangements, noting the requirement to have collaborators from at least two of the NAMRA partner organisations;
- Budget required for the project;
- Curriculum Vitae
